

Hemophilia B Clinical Research Study

If you are male, between the ages of 18 and 65 years, and have hemophilia B, you may be eligible to take part in this study.

The purpose of the study is to learn about the safety, tolerability, effectiveness, and long-term health effects of an investigational product (“the study drug”) for people with hemophilia B.

The study drug is...

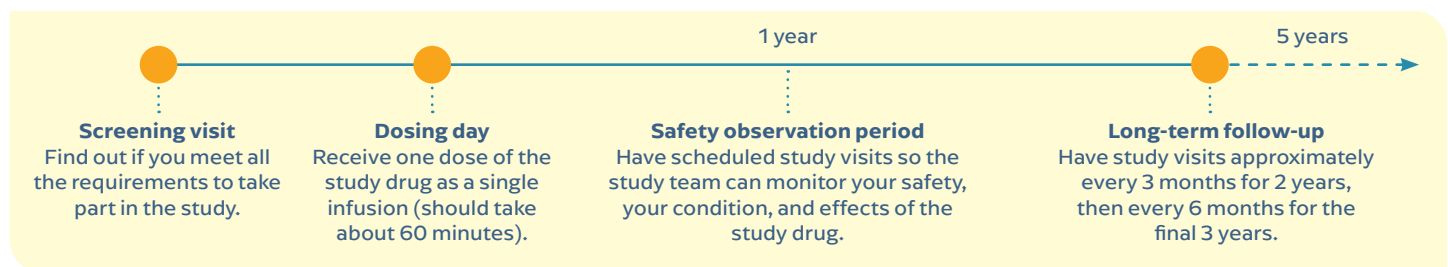
- ♦ Gene therapy
- ♦ Designed to introduce genetic material into cells to make up for missing or non functioning Factor IX
- ♦ Intended to be given only once
- ♦ Not approved by regulatory agencies

Taking part in this study is voluntary (your choice).

You can change your mind at any time and leave the study. Leaving the study will not affect your benefits or medical care you receive outside the study.

All study participants will receive the study drug.

What can I expect if I take part in the study?



What will happen at study visits?

Study procedures include (but are not limited to):

- ♦ Physical examinations
- ♦ Review of bleeding episodes and Factor IX use
- ♦ Collection of biological samples (such as blood, semen, saliva, urine)
- ♦ Review of side effects and medications
- ♦ Questionnaires about your quality of life, your activities, and your hemophilia

You may have some study visits at your home.

Will taking part in the study cost me anything?

Study drug and study procedures will be provided at no cost to you. You may also be reimbursed for:

- ♦ Travel to and from study visits
- ♦ Hotel costs while attending study visits
- ♦ Parking while at the study site
- ♦ Meals related to study visits

Will I continue my current hemophilia B treatments?

After you receive the study drug, you will stop your regularly scheduled Factor IX therapy. If the study drug is not effective for you, you may resume your prior hemophilia treatments.
